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Florida International Trade & Services Overview

With two-way merchandise trade of \$153.6 billion, combined with services exports of \$43.3 billion and the value of foreign direct investment (FDI) of \$81 billion, international business continued to be one of the state's strongest sectors in 2019, even with the economic challenges that affected global commerce.

- Total merchandise trade (exports plus imports) gained just one tenth of a percent (0.1 percent) last year, growing to \$153.6 billion. Merchandise exports (goods that are shipped from and through Florida) fell by -1.6 percent to \$72.3 billion while imports gained 1.6 percent to \$81.3 billion.
- Moving up to 7th in the U.S., Florida-origin exports to the world declined by -2.1 percent to \$56.0 billion in 2019, while U.S. exports fell by -1.3 percent. Only two of the top ten states showed growth Texas and Pennsylvania.
- Florida's services exports, which primarily consist of travel/tourism and transportation activities, were valued at \$42.9 billion and ranked 4th in the U.S. in 2018.
- Employment at majority foreign-owned firms reached a high of 368,100 in 2017, an increase of 1,700 jobs over 2016. Florida maintained its FDI-employment ranking as 1st in the Southeast and 4th in the U.S.
- Gross property, plant, and equipment attributable to foreign direct investment was valued at \$80.6 billion in 2017, a 3 percent increase over 2016.

Florida's Export Sector

 More than 58,000 Florida companies export, accounting for 20 percent of all U.S. exporters in 2018 the second highest state in the U.S. after California.

- Ninety-six percent (96%) of Florida exporters are small or medium-sized enterprises (SMEs) with 500 or fewer employees.
- These small and medium-sized companies accounted for 62 percent of Florida exports in 2016. This is the second-highest figure among the 50 states, and much higher than the U.S. average of 33 percent.



Impact on Employment & Wages

- According to The Business Roundtable:
 - ➤ International trade including exports of goods and services plus imports supports 2.4 million Florida jobs.
 - More than one in five Florida jobs were supported by international trade in 2017 and trade-related jobs grew three times faster than total employment in the state between 1992 and 2017.
- A study published by the International Trade Administration (ITA) in 2015 on weekly earnings of U.S. manufacturing and services industry employees estimates that:
 - Nationally, earnings in export-intensive *manufacturing* industries are 16.3 percent higher on average than industries where exports were ten percent or less of their total shipments.
 - Blue-collar workers in export-intensive *manufacturing* firms earn a 19 percent wage premium compared to the average manufacturing salary.
 - White-collar workers in management and professional occupations in export-intensive manufacturing companies earn a 9.9 percent wage premium.
 - Export-intensive *services* industry workers also earn an additional 15.5 percent more on average than comparable workers in non-export intensive services sectors.
 - The earnings premium for *all* workers in export-intensive firms in both the manufacturing and services sectors is about 16 percent.
- The Florida Chamber of Commerce's "Florida Trade and Logistics Study 2.0" reported that:
 - More than half a million Floridians hold jobs in trade and logistics industries.
 - > Jobs in Florida's trade and logistics industries pay 30 percent higher wages than the state average.
 - Roughly 1 in 7 Florida manufacturing jobs depend on exports.
- The U.S. Bureau of Economic Analysis (BEA) reports that majority-foreign-owned companies are responsible for 368,100 jobs in the state, including 68,700 manufacturing jobs (2017).
- According to a report published by the Organization for International Investment that analyzed how the U.S. benefits from foreign direct investment, 955,500 Florida jobs are tied to FDI in the state.



Merchandise Trade

Total Merchandise Trade

- In 2019, Florida's total merchandise trade (exports plus imports) totaled \$153.6 billion, a gain of just 0.1 percent in two-way trade over 2018. U.S. total trade fell by -1.3 percent in the same period.
- Merchandise exports from Florida decreased by -1.6 percent in 2019, while merchandise imports gained 1.6 percent.
- The Miami Customs District was the 13th busiest district in the U.S. in 2019 but down by 1.5 percent in total trade, while the Tampa Customs District gained 3.4 percent.
- The Miami Customs District was one of only eight Customs Districts that had a trade surplus in 2019 the third largest surplus of the 43 physical Districts nationwide.
- Florida recorded two-way trade of one billion (\$1 billion) or higher with 36 trade partners in 2019.
 Total trade with Brazil alone was \$21 billion, two times higher than trade with China, the second largest partner. (Visit our website to see two-way trade profiles of Florida's top 50 trade partners).

Merchandise Exports

- Merchandise exports goods that are shipped from and through Florida totaled \$72.3 billion in 2019, saw a -1.6 percent decrease over 2018. U.S. exports lost 1.4 percent during the same period.
- Among the state's top ten merchandise export destinations, all but four remained in positive territory.
 Argentina and Paraguay lost -8.8 percent -7.3 percent, respectively, while exports to Honduras and Costa Rica fell by smaller degrees of -1.5 percent and just -0.6 percent. Each of the remaining top ten countries saw growth in 2019.



- Shipments to each of the top four export destinations showed a second straight year of growth. Brazil
 and Colombia led the export destinations with growth of 7.3 percent and 2.6 percent, followed by Chile
 and Dominican Republic who saw growth of 3.3 percent and 3.2 percent, respectively.
- Among the top 25 markets, the largest percentage increases in merchandise exports from Florida
 occurred with Italy (23.3 percent); the Bahamas (19.5 percent), and Canada (205.2 percent). (Note
 that merchandise exports to Canada do not reflect goods that are shipped by truck from Florida to
 Canada. Those goods are considered exports of the Customs District where the truck crosses the
 U.S./Canada border.)
- Exports to China saw the largest percentage decline among the top 25 markets of 45 percent, valued at 669.6 million. Exports of Gold alone fell to zero, accounting for \$631.6 million, or 94 percent, of the total decline. In contrast, the Miami Customs District was the leading district for exports of Gold to China from 2016 to 2018, then dropped to zero in 2019.

- While the state's exports declined slightly overall, Florida's aviation industry exports of Civilian Aircraft, Engines, and Parts (#1) remained a key stimulant as it showed sustained growth of 17.3 percent (\$1.5 billion) to a total of \$10.5 billion in 2019.
- Civilian Aircraft, Engines and Parts accounted for 14.6 percent of all Florida Merchandise Exports in 2019, up from a 12.2 percent share in 2018.
- Decreases in exports of Telecommunications Equipment (#2) and Passenger Motor Cars & Vehicles
 (#3) fell by -5.6 percent and -13.5 percent, respectively, for a combined loss of nearly \$750 million.
- Yachts & Other Vessels (#13) saw the largest growth as those exports increased by \$201.7 million.
 The next largest gains were seen in exports of Electronic Circuits & Parts (#8), which increased by \$153.8 million during 2019.

Merchandise Imports

- Florida merchandise imports recorded a gain of 1.6 percent to \$81.3 billion in 2019, while the U.S. overall saw a loss of -1.7 percent.
- China remained the top import market for Florida, even while falling by -10.3 percent in 2019 and accounting for a \$1.1 billion loss.
- Imports from third-ranked Brazil fell for the second year in a row (-8.7 percent in 2019) to \$5.2 billion, primarily due to a \$1.0 billion loss in goods of special categories (imports of various products made with parts of American origin).
- Among the top 25 markets, imports from France (#8) and Vietnam (#12) saw double-digit growth of 26 percent and 43.9 percent, respectively, with dollar gains of greater than \$500 million each.
- Other significant losses among the top 25 markets include Spain (#21) of -41.2 percent or \$639.5 million and sixth-ranked Chile with a decline of -9.0 or \$352.1 million.
- Twenty (20) markets accounted for imports of \$1.0 billion or more during 2019.




- Motor Cars & Vehicles topped the list of import commodities (\$11.8 billion) and increased 3.6 percent (\$412.5 million) over 2018. Imports of Turbojets & Turbines surged by 94.0 percent from \$1.0 billion to \$2.0 billion while imports of Gold fell by 42.7 percent, nearly \$1.0 billion.


Total Merchandise Trade by World Region

• Latin America and the Caribbean, combined, account for 34.3 percent of the state's total merchandise trade; Asia – 32.7 percent; Europe accounts for 23.3 percent; Canada & Mexico* – 7.0 percent; the Middle East – 1.9 percent; the African Continent and Australia & Oceania – less than one percent each.



As evidence of the state's long-time position as a global hub, Florida accounts for 30.4 percent of total U.S. trade with Latin America and the Caribbean – 27.5 percent of total U.S. trade with South America; 34.2 percent of total trade with Central America and 38.9 percent with the Caribbean.





- Florida also accounts for 33.6 percent of all U.S. merchandise exports to Latin America and the Caribbean and 25.6 percent of all merchandise imports from the region.
- Those shares make Florida the leading U.S. state for total trade, exports, and imports with the Latin American and Caribbean region.

*Because Canada and Mexico share common borders with the U.S., most exports from Florida are shipped by truck or rail and are not calculated as part of the merchandise trade statistics. Please refer to the Florida-Origin Exports section below for a more accurate assessment of Florida's exports to Canada and Mexico.



 Florida was the seventh-largest export state in the U.S. in 2019, with \$56 billion in exports that originated in the state.

- 2019 Florida-origin exports to the world decreased by -2.1 percent over 2018 (\$1.2 billion) while U.S. exports fell by -1.25 percent.
- The make-up of the top ten destinations for Florida-origin exports in 2019 which make up 45 percent of the state's total exports remained nearly the same. Exports to the United Kingdom and Germany both saw double-digit losses (-10.0 percent and -20.1 percent, respectively) but remained in the top 10. China, however, dropped to 11th place as those shipments contracted by -34.2 percent in 2019.




• The leading export commodities produced in the state were: Aircraft, Engines & Parts (\$7.5 billion); Telecommunications Equipment (\$4.0 billion); Computers & Components (\$1.9 billion); Fertilizers (\$1.8 billion), and Electronic Integrated Circuits (\$1.3 billion). Gold in various forms fell by -37 percent.

Florida-Origin Exports by World Region

- Florida-origin exports accounted for 16.8 percent of all U.S. exports to Latin American and the Caribbean in 2019 (#2 after Texas); 15.0 percent of U.S. exports to South America; 15.5 percent of exports to Central America, and 25.3 percent of U.S. exports to the Caribbean.
- Latin America and the Caribbean remains the leading region for Florida-origin exports at 48.7 percent.





Florida Manufactured Exports

- At \$51.4 billion, Florida ranks fifth in the U.S. for manufactured exports, and 8th in the U.S. for non-manufactured exports (\$4.7 billion).
- Florida's manufactured exports decreased by -2.5 percent, at the same pace as the U.S. growth of -2.5 percent.
- In 2019, manufactured exports accounted for 92 percent of Florida's total exports, compared to 83 percent for the U.S. overall.
- Though Computer and Electronic Products exports decreased by \$986 million, Transportation Equipment exports increased by \$909 million.

- Florida is number three in the U.S. in *export-intensity* after Nevada and Washington meaning the state has the third-highest level of manufactured exports as a share of manufacturers' shipments.
- Thirty-seven percent (37%) of what is produced in the state is exported, compared to a national average of 20 percent.

Florida Metropolitan Statistical Area (MSA) Exports

- In 2018, Florida's 22 Metropolitan Statistical Areas (MSAs) exported \$53.5 billion in goods, gaining 1.2 percent over 2017. The state's MSA exports accounted for 3.2 percent of all U.S. MSA exports.
- Non-metropolitan exports from Florida were \$793.7 in 2018, a two percent increase from 2017.
- Seven of Florida's MSAs each generated more than \$1.0 billion in exports in 2018 while two MSAs (#9 Miami-Fort Lauderdale-West Palm Beach and #59 Tampa-St. Petersburg-Clearwater MSA) ranked in the top 60 for the entire U.S.

Information Technology Exports of Products and Services

- Florida was the 3rd largest exporter of information technology products in the U.S. (after Texas and California) with shipments of \$12.1 billion in 2019, a -7.5 percent drop over 2018. The U.S. total decreased by -2.1 percent overall, for the year.
- Florida's share of total U.S. information technology exports was 5.8 percent in 2019, while twenty-two (22) percent of Florida-origin exports were high-tech products in 2019.
- Information Technology exports were the leading Florida-origin export category, followed by Transportation Equipment and Chemicals.



- CompTIA's "Tech Trade Snapshot" reports that Florida ranked 15th in the U.S. for tech services exports valued at \$2.2 billion in 2017, a 3.9 percent increase over 2016.
- They also estimate that 39,948 direct jobs are supported by Florida's tech exports (35,031 related to goods and 4,917 for services), a 7.9 percent increase over 2016.
- While Florida is ranked 4th in the U.S. for total direct jobs supported by tech exports overall, the state ranks 3rd for jobs related to goods exports and 15th for jobs related to services exports.
- The Internet Association's "A Look at American Digital Exports" estimated the number of jobs supported by digital exports in 2016. Florida's digital export volume was estimated to be \$3.1 billion (4th in the U.S) with 7,500 jobs supported by the state's services exports (also 4th in the U.S.)

Services Exports

- Florida's large multi-cultural, multi-lingual workforce is a significant exporter of knowledge-based services. Services provided to overseas clients include accounting; architectural; communications; consulting; design; education; engineering; financial; legal; medical; transportation, and others.
- According to the Washington, D.C.-based *Coalition of Services Industries*, Florida ranked fourth in the U.S. with \$42.9 billion in services exports in 2018 and grew by 63 percent from 2009 to 2018.
- An estimated 316,900 jobs were supported in Florida by services exports in 2018.





 As expected, there is heavy emphasis on travel (including activities related to international visitors) and transportation (such as international air and ocean services).



• Select markets for Florida services include the United Kingdom (\$3.5 billion); Canada (\$3.4 billion); China \$3.0 billion); Japan (\$2.5 billion); Mexico (\$2.4 billion), and Korea (\$1.1 billion).



Foreign Direct Investment (FDI)

Florida is a national leader in attracting companies from overseas and from just across U.S. borders to the north and south. Investing in a wide variety of industries, foreign companies employ not only Floridians, they also bring capital, expertise, technology and innovation. The Bureau of Economic Analysis reports the following.

Among majority-foreign-owned affiliates, Florida is:

- 1st in the Southeast and 4th in the U.S. for employment (368,100 in 2017).
- 6th in the Southeast and 15th in the U.S. for the number of FDI-related manufacturing jobs (68,700).

Among ALL foreign-owned affiliates, Florida is:

- 1st in the Southeast and 4th in the U.S. for employment (432,500 in 2017).
- 2nd in the Southeast and 7th in the U.S. for investment in gross plant, property, and equipment (\$80.6 billion in 2017).

The state is also:

• 2nd in the Southeast and 14th in the U.S. for "first-year expenditures" by foreign direct investors.

Employment at Majority Foreign-Owned Companies

- According to the Bureau of Economic Analysis, Florida ranked fourth (4th) in the nation in 2017 in terms
 of foreign direct investment (FDI) employment, and 1st in the Southeastern U.S., with a total of 368,100
 jobs supported by majority foreign-owned companies.
- The number of employees at majority-owned U.S. affiliates of foreign entities in Florida grew by 135,200 (58.1 percent) from 2010 to 2017.
- Majority foreign-owned companies from Europe account for 58 percent of all FDI employment in Florida. Canadian-owned firms account for 13 percent and companies from Asia/Pacific countries represent another 12 percent, while Latin America/Caribbean/Mexico represents six percent.

- Manufacturing employment at majority foreign-owned companies in Florida accounts for 68,700 jobs, the largest share of all FDI employment at 18.7 percent.
- Florida ranks 15th in the nation in the number of FDI-related manufacturing jobs and is in the top ten for employment in every other industry sector. The state leads the nation in FDI-related jobs in Real Estate and Rental & Leasing.

Employment and Value of Gross Property, Plant, & Equipment at ALL Florida Foreign-Owned Affiliates

- When considering *all* foreign-owned affiliates and not just majority foreign-owned affiliates Florida ranked 1st in the Southeast and 4th in the U.S. with a total of 432,500 jobs supported by foreign-owned firms in 2017. This was a gain of 7.0 percent over 2016.
- The Bureau of Economic Analysis also reported that the value of Gross Plant, Property, & Equipment
 at all foreign-owned affiliates in Florida was \$80.6 billion in 2017, up by 3.0 percent over 2016. These
 investments ranked Florida number two in the Southeast and 7th in the U.S.

First-Year Expenditures by Foreign Direct Investors

- The Bureau of Economic Analysis reports that "first-year expenditures" by foreign direct investors to acquire, establish, or expand businesses in Florida were \$2.6 billion in 2018.
- Florida ranked 2nd in the Southeast in 2018 in terms of first-year expenditures by foreign direct investors, and 14th in the U.S.

Impact on Jobs and Wages

According to the Organization for International Investment's 2016 report entitled "Jobs We Need:"



- 955,500 jobs in the state can be attributed to global investment/FDI, including both direct FDI jobs and related supply chain jobs.
- Florida ranks 1st in the Southeast and 6th in the U.S. for direct and indirect jobs related to FDI.
- Every direct FDI job created in Florida supports another three additional jobs in the state.
- Thirty percent of manufacturing jobs in Florida are supported by global investment.
- Direct FDI jobs in Florida provide an average annual compensation (wages and benefits) of \$63,300 versus an overall state average compensation of \$46,100. Average compensation for direct FDI jobs in the *manufacturing sector* is even higher at \$70,900, which is \$24,800 more than the state average.
