FLORIDA'S INTERNATIONAL BUSINESS FAST FACTS

INTERNATIONAL TRADE



Florida is home to more than **55,000** exporting companies – second in the nation. One out of every five (20%) U.S. exporters is located in Florida.

94% of Florida exporters are small or mediumsized enterprises (SMEs) with 500 or fewer employees. SMEs accounted for **56%** of Florida exports in 2023.

With \$197 billion in two-way merchandise trade in 2024, Florida is a major gateway for trade between North America, Latin America, the Caribbean and other world regions. \$89 billion in exports and \$108 billion in imports were shipped through the state's 16 seaports and 21 commercial service airports.

Widely recognized as a global hub for the Western Hemisphere, Florida accounts for nearly 30% of total U.S. trade with Latin America and the Caribbean.

Florida ranks sixth in the nation in stateorigin exports (i.e., those produced, or with significant value-added) and reached an all-time record of \$72 billion in 2024.

TRANSPORTATION AND INFRASTRUCTURE

Florida sits at the nexus of transportation links in the Americas. Florida's 16 deepwater seaports, 21 commercial service airports and 3 spaceports ensure the seamless movement of travelers and goods throughout the state. (Florida Department of Transportation)





Florida's seaports and airports handled more than 46 million metric tons of internationally traded goods in 2024.

Home to the second largest foreign trade zone (FTZ) network in the nation, Florida has 19 FTZs statewide.

Miami International Airport (MIA) ranks number one busiest airport in the U.S. for international freight shipments and second busiest for international passengers in 2024. MIA offers more service to Latin America and the Caribbean than any other airport in the U.S. (Miami International Airport)



INTERNATIONAL VISITORS



Florida welcomed a record total of 12.3 million international visitors in 2024, including 3.4 million Canadian travelers. (VISIT FLORIDA Research)

International visitors contribute to Florida's tourism economy, spending \$14.9 billion in 2023. (VISIT FLORIDA, Economic Impact Study)





Florida was the #2 most visited state in the U.S. by overseas visitors in 2024, accounting for 25% of the national total, excluding visitors from Canada and Mexico.

MARKET SIZE AND GLOBAL RANKING



With a Gross Domestic Product of nearly \$1.8 trillion in 2025, Florida would be the 15th largest economy globally if ranked as a country, similar in size to the economies of Spain and South Korea. (Bureau of Economic Analysis and the International Monetary Fund)



Florida ranks as the third largest U.S. state in the country with a population of 23 million in 2024, making it an attractive consumer market for both domestic and overseas producers and suppliers. (U.S. Census Bureau)



The state also had the fastest-growing population in the U.S. by percentage and the second fastest-growing population in the U.S. by numeric growth in 2024. (U.S. Census Bureau)
